We are The Episcopal Church

Emmanuel, like so many other churches around the country, is standing on a ledge between what was and what will be. I had a conversation with a visitor this past Sunday, a mom, her husband and their 4-year-old son, came to visit Emmanuel. The mother shared with me that she and her husband have been members of the Evangelical Church, but since they've had their child they have been questioning the values and mission of the Evangelical Church. The Evangelical Church tends to be more conservative socially and culturally, and their theology is grounded in being good in this life so one can go to heaven in the next. The mother, who is Latina/Hispanic, has experienced racism within the Evangelical Church as well. The mother communicated to me that the values of that denomination no longer align with what she and her husband believe, and they don't want their son growing up in that kind of church environment.

But she wants her family to be part of a church community. She has been researching denominations and found The Episcopal Church (TEC). A church with a progressive outlook theologically as well as socially and culturally, TEC seems like it would be a good fit for her and her friends, 40 somethings with children, who are leaving the Evangelical Church and looking for a community more inclusive, loving, and open.

We, as the church, however, have done a poor job evolving with the times in order to stay in step with what the population between the ages of 30 and 45 need. This is a group of people who want a supportive community, and one that is active with ministry in the surrounding community. They want an inclusive community, that is diverse and welcoming of all people regardless of race, ethnicity, sexual orientation or gender identity. They want to raise their children in a place that doesn't just talk about Jesus but walks the walk of Jesus in their church community and the wider community as well.

This is who we are at Emmanuel, an ever-evolving community of love and compassion, inclusion and diversity, where people can find hope and engage in service that is meaningful in our surrounding communities. We are The Episcopal Church and all are welcome.

Hello Emmanuel Friends!

The first half of the year in 2022 showed a net loss of \$28,898.95.

We have income for several sources, most importantly Tithes and Offerings, but also renting out our facility, large donations from very generous donors, as well as the endowment given to Emmanuel by John Voss. For the first half of this year, our total income was \$143,734.13.

Like most of you can relate, the church's expenses have also increased. Through June our total Expenses were \$172,633.08. This compares with the total for 2021, which was \$148,014.23. Not much has changed substantially, but the cost of materials and services, and our Mission Share Fund has increased.

As we have all noticed our congregation has decreased in size ... we are a small-church with big-church obligations. We continue to give to those in desperate need, maintaining our beautiful grounds and facilities, and the personnel that are working so hard to make Emmanuel Episcopal Church run so efficiently. We all need to see if we can do more. I know that is difficult, but the giving of more time and/or money will go a long way to get us through these challenging times. Maybe the 'doing more' lies in inviting friends and neighbors to visit, getting more members to join our loving family.

Thank you for your continued support of Emmanuel Episcopal Church, we have an amazingly generous community that I am so thankful for.

The Episcopal Church, part of the worldwide Anglican Church, uses the word "collect" instead of prayer. A collect is simply a prayer meant to gather the intentions of the people and the focus of worship into a succinct prayer.

All of the collects more or less fit a pattern that was developed—and some would say perfected—by Archbishop Cranmer in the first Book of Common Prayer (1549). The form of collects is actually quite simple.

- 1. There is an address to God and to his character or actions in the world on our behalf.
- 2. There is a request.
- 3. There is an invocation and doxology.
- 4. And there is the "Amen."

We are adding a new page to the Epistle this month. We are calling it "Collect Corner" by Carolyn Cardamis. Carolyn has been putting her talents as a poet to writing collects. She will be sharing them with us, right here, every month. Enjoy!
