Junior Warden's Corner

In the August issue of the Epistle, I began listing all the work that has been done since January 2019 so that you know how much change has taken place. That list continues in this, the September issue. Next month, I will detail what still has to be done.

Many of you were not on the church property during the long months of the pandemic. And some of you have not been able to come back yet. These renovations have been funded mostly by private donations, with a small contribution from the church's capital fund. We did not have to take out loans. Please ask for a tour of our renovated buildings. You'll be amazed!

Good Shepherd Building/Discovery Gardens Building

- Interior redesigned to accommodate the new Discovery Gardens Early Learning Center: two walls removed to create a large center classroom
- New tile plank flooring
- Water damage addressed and beams, studs, and drywall repaired
- New dual pane energy-efficient windows
- Interior and exterior, fascia boards and roof flashing painted
- New security system installed and entry door rekeyed
- Beautiful new fencing installed around the Discovery Gardens playground

Sanctuary / Sacristy

- Street side (south side) of the building repainted and damaged and leaking gutters replaced
- New locks installed on all doors
- Red doors repainted
- Church pews refinished
- Memorial garden renovated: removal of overgrown shrubs, new lattice fencing, new rose bushes, trees and vines. Watering system and path added.

Garden

- Vineyard replanted with about 135 disease resistant vines.
- St. Francis garden upgraded (Project donated by Josh Oates for an Eagle Scout project).
- Children's garden for the new Early Learning Center reimagined
- Asphalt removed from playground and replaced with Outdoor Education project areas
- Community Garden planting beds and compost beds upgraded.
- Five large trees removed because of age and dry rot



An Important Message from Your Treasurer

Operating income for June was \$17,842.48 while expenses were \$26,074.36. This means we had a net operating fund loss of

\$8,231.88 for the month. Year to date, the Operating Fund has a deficit of \$27,961.42. Last year at this point the deficit was \$43,254.29. Giving from the congregation so far this year is \$124,949 which is down significantly from last year which was \$137,832 at the same point in time.

We had expenses in July of about \$5,300.00 related to the reopening of the Emmanuel Environmental Early Learning Center (EEELC) to cover the salary of the new Director (plus about another \$1500 for related taxes, etc.) With the Early Learning Center opening in mid-August, the need for the Church to support the Early Learning Center should be coming to an end.

Our new playground fencing has been installed and it looks great! There's a little work left to do but that should be done well before you receive this newsletter. We're still about \$3,500 short of having enough donations to fund it so we could really use your help to cover the remaining amount. If you'd like to help, please note "Playground Fence" on your check or make an eGiving online donation to the Preschool and send me an email to let me know that it's for the playground fencing project.
